



## **KEYNOTE**

Swap shops and networking

David Zeeck, president & publisher, News Tribune

Dave Zeeck has been president and publisher of The News Tribune since 2008. As president and publisher, Zeeck oversees the daily newspaper operations in Tacoma and Olympia, as well as the community weeklies in Gig Harbor and Puyallup and the base newspaper at Joint Base Lewis-McChord. He also oversees digital media operations that include cars.com and careerbuilder.com in the South Sound.

Before that he was executive editor of The News Tribune for 14 years. He came to Tacoma in 1994, after 20 years at The Kansas City Star as a reporter and editor. At The Star, he was an editor on projects that won Pulitzer prizes for local and national reporting.

In addition to being past chair of the Economic Development Board for Tacoma-Pierce County, Zeeck serves as a member of the Executive Council for a Greater Tacoma and is chair of the advisory board for the University of Washington - Tacoma. He is also on the boards of two industry organizations: Pacific Northwest Newspaper Association and Allied Daily Newspapers of Washington. He is a past-president of the American Society of Newspaper Editors.

He received an MBA from Rockhurst College in Kansas City and a bachelor of journalism degree from the University of Missouri. He is a Presbyterian and an Eagle Scout. He is married to Valarie S. Zeeck, a partner in a Tacoma law firm. They have two grown sons. Zeeck is proud to be a Texan by birth and a Tacoman by choice.
