
WJEA Journalism Day 2014

Paris Jackson is the KOMO 4 Morning News Weekday Traffic Anchor/ Reporter. She also reports during the 11 a.m. newscast. She joined the KOMO 4 News Team in June of 2013 and is thrilled to return home to the Pacific Northwest to work amongst journalists she grew up watching.

Paris comes from Birmingham, Alabama, where she worked at WVTM-TV, the NBC affiliate, as an Evening Reporter. She began her journalism career as a reporter for KEZI-TV, the ABC affiliate in Eugene, Oregon. She interned with KING 5 –TV, the NBC affiliate, in Seattle.

Paris' work has earned her a Regional Emmy and Associated Press awards. She's a member of the National Association of Black Journalists and the Seattle chapter.

A graduate of Washington State University's Edward R. Murrow School of Communication, she earned a bachelor's degree in Communication and double majored in Broadcast News and Ethnic Studies. In her spare time, she enjoys volunteering, mentoring and rooting for the Cougars and Seahawks.


