Keynote: Sarah Stuteville

Sarah is a print and multimedia journalist and a cofounder of the Seattle Globalist--an online publication that covers international issues in The Pacific Northwest. She won the 2011 Sigma Delta Chi Award for magazine writing from the Society of Professional Journalists for her article The Return: One Marine's story of a mission accomplished, but not really over, published by Pacific Northwest Magazine, as well as three 2011 Northwest Excellence in Journalism for her reporting in northern Iraq and Syria. This year she produced the feature-length documentary Barzan which was an official selection in the 2013 Seattle International Film Festival and co-produced an hour-long radio special on young people and politics in the former Soviet Union for The Seattle Globalist and Public Radio Exchange. In addition to reporting, Sarah teaches entrepreneurial journalism and documentary film-making at the University of Washington. She also writes a weekly column on local/global intersections for The Seattle Times and The Seattle Globalist.

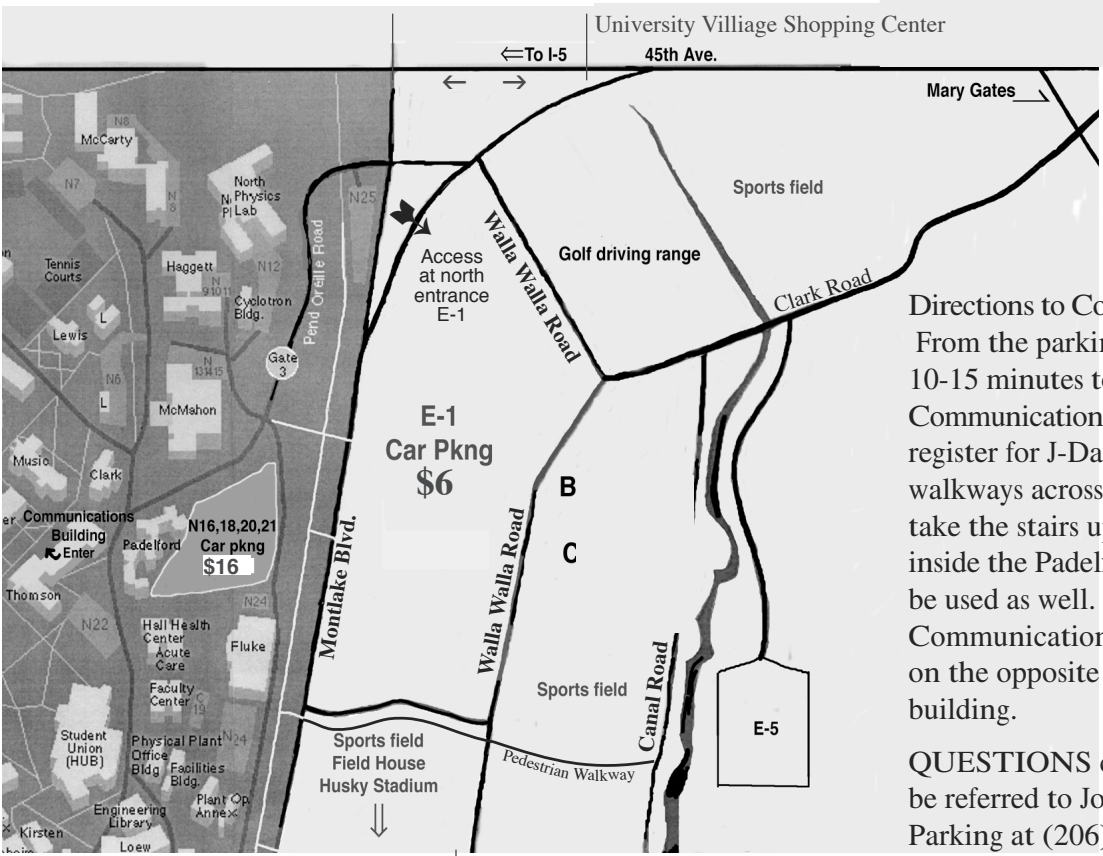

Directions to Communications Building:
From the parking area, it takes about 10-15 minutes to walk up the hill to the Communications Building where you will register for J-Day.
