Details about WJEA Student Summer Camp

Boredom? Never a problem at WJEA Summer Camp. Students receive 16-18 hours of intensive training in their chosen "major" session over the three days on campus. In addition, they choose three "minor" sessions from a long list of topics. There will be a sign-up for minors at check-in on the first day. With all the intensive and interactive learning, there is still time for social activities and recreation.
