Details about WJEA Student Summer Camp

Boredom? Never a problem at WJEA Summer Camp. Students receive 16-18 hours of intensive training in their chosen “major” session over the three days on campus. In addition, they choose three “minor” sessions from a long list of topics. There will be a sign-up for minors at check-in on the first day. With all the intensive and interactive learning, there is still time for social activities and recreation. All session presenters are certificated teachers with years of experience in their areas of expertise. The ratio between students and staff is 10:1. This is also true at night, with dorm supervisors staying on student floors. Girls and boys do not share floors or restroom facilities. Except for small stipends paid for event management, WJEA is an all-volunteer organization, and is affiliated with the national Journalism Education Association.
