AWARDS, SCHOLARSHIPS, CRITIQUES

Adviser Scholarships (2): Members may apply for a \$750 grant for professional development or national JEA/NSPA convention. One grant is given to an experienced adviser and one to a new adviser with three or fewer years of service.

Adviser of the Year: From nominations made by student editors and/or principals, a committee chooses the outstanding adviser, who is announced at the spring conference in March. Only members are eligible.

Outstanding Service Dorothy McPhillips Award: Presented to an adviser for outstanding service to WJEA. This is the organization's highest honor. (Not awarded every year.)

Fern Valentine Freedom of Expression Award: One WJEA member/adviser receives a \$500 cash award for fighting censorship issues and maintaining student free speech. (Not awarded every year.)

Lu Flannery Outstanding Journalist Award: One journalism senior (newspaper, yearbook or broadcast) is honored, plus \$2,000 is applied to tuition at the college of his/her choice. Advisers of all applicants must be WJEA members.

State Journalist of the Year; Robin Morris Scholarship: One journalism senior (newspaper, online, yearbook or broadcast) is awarded this honor, plus \$2,000 applied to tuition at the college of his/her choice. The winner is Washington's entry into the national JEA competition which will announced at the national JEA/NSPA Spring Convention.

Student Study Grants: Two or more WJEA Summer Workshop study grants are awarded to students in grades 8-11.

Administrator of the Year: An administrator is selected for recognition from nominations sent in by members. Criteria includes a strong support for student press rights.

Year-end WJEA Award Plaques: Special Recognition Plaques for student journalists may be purchased, or are free to the first 50 members who apply (one free plaque per member). Application available in March at **www.wjea.org**.

Media Critiques and Emerald Awards: WJEA members may submit samples of the current year's student newspapers, yearbook, broadcast and online media for feedback from qualified evaluators from around the country. WJEA Emerald Awards will be chosen from submitted media and top honors will be announced at Journalism Day WEST in the fall..

WORSHOPS & COMPETITIONS

Summer Workshops: The late July or early August workshops provide four days of training for advisers and students. Advisers may earn OSPI clock-hours. The 2023 workshop will be at Washington State University in Pullman WA.

WJEA Journalism Days West and East: Professional journalists present sessions on a range of topics, including yearbook and broadcast sessions. Keynote speaker: Western Washington: Early October; Eastern Washington: late October.

State Conference & Write-offs: Newspaper, yearbook and broadcast learning sessions presented by professionals, and student contests in a range of journalistic skills are offered at this one-day statewide conference in early March.
